

Official DC:0-5™ Training

Offered by ZERO TO THREE-endorsed trainers with the ARCh Project at the Center for Child & Family Health

ZERO TO THREE's Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood (DC:0-5™) is compatible with the DSM-5, the ICD-10, and the ICD-11, and NC Medicaid endorses its use. It is the only developmentally sensitive, multi-axial classification system for diagnosing mental health and developmental disorders in infants and young children, a complex process that requires dyadic assessment of caregivers and children, recognition of the different developmental expressions of mental health symptoms, and awareness of contextual considerations.

WHO

Licensed Clinicians in NC:
Licensed psychologists, licensed clinical social workers, licensed professional counselors, psychiatrists, pediatricians, and nurse practitioners whose work with infants and young children involves clinical assessment and diagnosis of mental health disorders.
